DEADLINES

Registration of competitors takes place from September 1, 2023 to February 1, 2024.

Sending a link to the competition video from February 1 to February 25, 2024.

Announcement of winners and results from March 1 to March 10, 2024.

Sending prizes to winners from March 5 to March 15, 2024.

ENTRY FEE

The entry fee varies by category. Adults pay 20 EUR, children 15 EUR and duo 27 EUR.

If you participate in two or more categories, you will receive a discount of 10%.

The entry fee must be paid to the bank account: 236759195/0300 within 7 days of registration. In the note, state your name, surname and category.

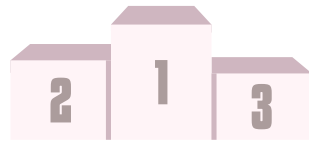

AWARDS

The winners of the first three places in each category will receive valuable prizes, a medal and a diploma, which will be delivered to them by post.

They will also have the opportunity to register for free for the next year competition.

A special prize will be awarded to the competitor who scored the most overall points from all categories and a special prize for the best art from all categories.



AERIAL HOOP CATEGORY

In this category, you can use a single-point or double-point hoop. The hoop can be taped or untaped, according to your preference. You can also choose the height and diameter of the hoop that suits you best. If you have a hoop modified differently than usual, for example with a hand loop, you must register in the Aerial art category.

SPECIAL CATEGORY AERIAL ART

In this category, you can use any other aerial acrobatics equipment. It can be aerial trapeze, aerial silks, mini aerial hoop, aerial loops, aerial hammock, aerial moon, aerial rope, aerial cube, cloud swing, aerial chains, flying pole, aerial straps, aerial net, aerial chair, aerial ladder or aerial chandelier.



AMATEUR AND PROFESSIONAL SUBCATEGORIES

The amateur subcategory includes those who have a given discipline only as a hobby, do not have any paid performances, are not instructors and have been training for less than 5 years. If you placed first, second or third in any competition in a given discipline, you also fall into the professional subcategory. The exception is if you placed in a competition with fewer than 6 participants. In this case, you do not have to switch to the professional subcategory if you meet the conditions for the amateur subcategory.

You do not have to be in the same subcategory for different disciplines. You can apply to different subcategories according to your abilities.

If you are unsure which subcategory you belong to, you can consult with the competition organizer. The organizer reserves the right to decide on your subcategory and move you to the professional subcategory if deemed appropriate.

(Choose the Aerial Hoop DUO category according to the age of the older of the pair)
Contestants can register for multiple categories. If there are 6 or fewer contestants in a category, only 1st place is awarded. If there are fewer than 3 contestants in a category, the category may be merged with another.

COSTUME

- The costume must not reveal intimate parts of the body.
- The costume may include props related to your choreography or theme.
- Any hairstyles and loose hair are allowed.

VIDEO

To participate in the competition, you need to create a video of your performance and send it to the organizer. Follow these steps:

Record a video of your performance on a camera or mobile phone.

Make sure the image and sound quality are good.

Shoot the video horizontally.

Upload the video to YouTube or Vimeo and leave it public for at least one month after the end of the competition.

Give the video a title according to this pattern: Acrovision – first and last name or stage name – category. Example: Acrovision – Jana Nováková – Aerial Hoop Amateur 18 years +.

Send the link to the video to the organizer at misa@v-kruhu.cz.

In the subject of the email, enter Acrovision – first and last name or stage name.

When creating a video, it is important to follow these rules:

- The video must be original and created specifically for this competition. Using a video from another competition or source is not allowed.
- Your entire body and any props (such as a bar, hoop, or scarf) must be visible throughout the performance.
- Editing of the video is not allowed, except for trimming the beginning and end.
- The video must not contain any music that would overlap with the original music in the video.
- Plagiarism of choreography, video, or music is strictly prohibited.

TO PARTICIPATE IN THE COMPETITION, YOU MUST FOLLOW THESE RULES

- Fill out the application and provide truthful information.
- Pay the entry fee.
- Respect the rules of the competition.
- Send a link to the video on YouTube or Vimeo.
- Behave in a sportsmanlike and polite manner towards other participants, the organizer, and the judges.
- Do not show intimate parts of your body.
- Meet all deadlines.
- Be healthy and able to compete.
- Do not violate copyright laws.
- Follow the time limit for the video.

If you violate any of these rules, you may be disqualified from the competition.

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

If you want to protect your privacy or your child's privacy, you can choose a stage name that will be used instead of your real name.

By entering the Acrovision competition, you give the organizer consent to use your videos for promotion of the competition and to publish and share your information (name or stage name, Instagram).

The organizer is not responsible for any injuries or damages that may occur to you during the competition.

The organizer reserves the right to change the rules of the competition.

The participant has the right to withdraw from the competition at any time, but without entitlement to a refund of the entry fee.

EVALUATION

Each of the criteria listed below is evaluated on a scale of 0-10 points



Technique - evaluated based on flawless and clean execution of elements, harmony and coordination of movements, smooth transitions between elements, correct body posture, and ability to manipulate the hoop or other prop.



Strength - evaluated based on the ability to hold static positions without shaking and to perform complex and demanding tricks.



Flexibility - evaluated based on the range of motion of joints and muscles and the ability to perform flexible elements and transitions.



Artistic impression - evaluated based on the expression of choreography through facial expressions and gestures, the ability to express a theme or story, and synchronization of movements with music.



Creativity - evaluated based on the ability to create an original and imaginative choreography that expresses a theme or story, use of space and music, inclusion of diverse and innovative elements and transitions, and demonstration of a distinctive and unique style. Creativity is also reflected in the costume, music, and overall impression of the contestant.



Dynamics - evaluated based on the ability to perform movements with high intensity and speed, such as jumps, landings, flips, spins, drops, or swings.



Balance – evaluated based on the ability to maintain balance and stability on the hoop or other apparatus, without falling or losing control. Difficulty is determined by the number of points of contact, duration of the position, and angle of the body.



Costume and make-up – evaluated based on the ability to choose clothing, make-up, and hairstyle that support the style, theme, or story of the performance.

In total, you can earn a maximum of 80 points.



FLOORWORK

Floorwork is optional. If you use it, it should take up no more than 15% of the time of your video. You can start or end your choreography on the ground or on the hoop.



PENALTIES

Up to 3 points are deducted for falls, slips, or loss of balance. Up to 2 points are deducted for wiping hands or adjusting oneself, costume problems, singing or speaking. Up to 3 points are deducted for inappropriate movements and unsportsmanlike behavior. Up to 2 points are deducted for each incomplete element. Up to 0.5 points are deducted for each mistake in lines (incorrect body shape or limb position).
